Five reasons to put your kids in

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS)

- CGS helps the child to understand and participate in the Mass.
- CGS gives your child a peaceful and quiet place of prayer in our loud and busy world.
- The younger the child starts (we accept them at 3), the easier it is for them to fall in love with God.
- CGS assists the child in wonder and curiosity about the Kingdom of God.
- CGS gives parents an opportunity and the time for their own spiritual formation.

What is Catechesis of the Good Shepherd? (CGS)

CGS is an approach to the faith formation of children ages 3 to 5th grade. St. Francis Borgia will use Catechesis of the Good Shepherd for ages 3, 4 and 5 (Level I) in Fall 2021.

The focus of the program is to deepen the child's existing relationship with God; to encourage the formation of a personal prayer life; to participate fully in the liturgical and sacramental life of the Church; and to develop a deeper understanding of Catholic identity and tradition.

CGS is rooted in the educational principles of Maria Montessori. It was founded by Sofia Cavalletti and Gianna Gobbi in Rome and has spread to almost every continent.

CGS utilizes the Montessori principles of multi-aging. Each of the three levels of CGS is a three year program:

- Level One is for children ages 3 through kindergarten.
- Level Two is for 1st-3rd grade.
- Level Three is for 4th and 5th grade.

What is an Atrium?

An Atrium is the room in which the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd takes place.

"The atrium is the meeting ground of two mysteries:

the mystery of God and the mystery of the child."

Level I (Ages 3 years old-K)

Level I encourages children to develop their innate potential for a faith-filled relationship with God. They encounter Jesus, the Good Shepherd who loves them, cares for them, and knows them by name. Catechesis includes Scripture, Mass gestures, prayers, artwork, and music. Level One is for children three years old through kindergarten.
